STEPHEN BROBECK

Stephen Brobeck has served as executive director of the Consumer Federation of America since 1980. From 1976 to 1979 he was a board member and vice president. CFA is an association of nearly 300 non-profit consumer groups that seeks to advance the consumer interest through research, advocacy, and education.

As CFA executive director, Brobeck frequently testifies before Congressional committees and is interviewed by national news media. He also has co-authored commercially published consumer guides to banking and product safety.

During the 1970s, Brobeck held the position of assistant professor of American Studies at Case Western Reserve University. Since then, he has served as a visiting professor at Cornell University and at the University of Utah and as an adjunct professor at the University of Maryland. He also has published research on social change, including the first annotated bibliography of the consumer movement and an encyclopedia of the consumer movement, which he edited.

Brobeck, who was born in 1944, graduated from Wheaton College (IL) with high honors and earned a Ph.D. in American Studies from the University of Pennsylvania. He is listed in "Who's Who in America" and serves on boards of several nonprofit organizations. From 1990 to 1996, he served as a director of the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond.
