

**Arthur Kennickell, PhD** is an independent consultant on economic measurement. For the 32 years prior to 2017, he was at the Federal Reserve Board, where he is best known for his development and leadership of the Survey of Consumer Finances and his contributions toward the establishment and nurturing of the Global Legal Entity Identifier System. He is a fellow of the American Statistical Association, a member of the board of the National Bureau of Economic Research and a recipient of the Julius Shiskin Award for innovation in economic statistics. He received BA and MA degrees from the University of Chicago in the humanities and a PhD degree in economics from the University of Pennsylvania. **He was the recipient of the ACCI "Friend of Consumer Award" in 2006.** His recent interests have focused on looking at the seriousness of the difficulties in comparing wealth concentration across various data as well as updating calculations on income and wealth inequality.
