3b. Women and Money: Unique Issues

- **My role:** I collaborated with Marion County Extension Faculty (L. Spence) and Madison County Extension Faculty (D. Douglas) to develop a statewide curriculum. I collect and analyze the evaluation data for the program statewide and update program materials as needed.
- **Target Audience:** Extension County Faculty and Floridians, specifically women.
- **Outputs:** The curriculum comprises five modules including a literature review, lesson plans, multi-media instructional presentations, EDIS publications, activities, and worksheets and evaluation. Thirty-five county faculty were trained on how to implement the original curriculum. The curriculum has also been used by the Alabama Cooperative Extension System. I am finalizing the revised curriculum that will be released at the 2024 FCS Summit.
- **Outcomes and Impacts:**

 - 26% of the 2013 participants (n=60) completed a follow up evaluation in 2014 (n= 6).
 - 40% of the respondents saved money ranging from \$150 to \$5,000.
 - 38% met with a financial planner.
 - 56% organized their personal finance documents.
 - 87% continued to track their spending.

3c. Annie's Project

- **My Role:** I received a Risk Management Agency grant to conduct multi-state Annie's Project sessions in Florida (Suwannee, Sarasota, Marion, and Osceola Counties), Georgia, South Carolina, and Alabama and at the National Farmers Union annual women's conference. I oversaw the multi-state project and coordinated the Florida efforts.
- **Target Audience:** Farm and ranch women
- **Outputs:** Annie's Project is a risk management educational program for women farmers and ranchers. Annie's Project sessions are focused on risk management including financial, production, marketing, legal, and human resources. To identify specific topics and unique needs of Floridians for the 2015 sessions, I conducted a stakeholder needs assessment through a focus group of prior Annie's Project participants and successful farm women in 2014. Six women participated in the focus group. I updated the Annie's Project Florida website, developed marketing materials, and helped to locate session

speakers. I presented on the unique financial issues women may experience throughout their life cycle. To increase the number of participants and pilot test a different delivery method, I presented a webinar titled "Property and Risk Liability for Small Farm & Ranch Women" to 20 participants.

- **Outcomes and Impacts:**

170 women participated in the multi-state Annie's Project.

- 66% changed practices that led to improved family/employee relationships.
- 55% completed or reviewed and family balance sheets.
- 7% updated farm leasing arrangements.
- 11% prepared/wrote a marketing plan.
- 17% modified property ownership methods to reduce exposure to liability.
- 33% created/updated an estate plan or will.
- 21% prepared legal or health care power of attorneys for key operators.
- 51 changed practices that led to improved farm or ranch profitability.

3d. Financial Fitness

- **My Role:** I collaborated with Alachua County Extension Faculty (B. Williams) to develop the third lesson on money and emotions in the Financial Fitness series. I presented the third session of each series at Catholic Charities in Alachua County.
- **Target Audience:** Adult Floridians
- **Outputs:** Financial Fitness is the first four-week series of a program, Bridges to Prosperity, with Catholic Charities. The sessions include building a spending plan, finding money in one's budget to save, the emotional aspect of money, and using credit wisely.
- **Outcomes and impacts:**
 - From 2012 – 2015, 373 participants completed the program.
 - Of the participants who completed the program evaluation, more than 75% reported a knowledge gain, developed a spending plan, and tracked their income and expenses.

3e. Small Steps to Health and Wealth for Older Adults

- **My Role:** I used findings from 15 focus groups to adapt Small Steps to Health and Wealth™ (a Rutgers University Extension curriculum) for use with older adults.
- **Target Audience:** County Extension Faculty and Older Floridians
- **Outputs:** Seven lesson plans have been developed to date, and include multi-media instructional presentations, lesson plans, activities, and evaluations. The Small Steps to Health and Wealth™ for Older Adults curriculum is designed motivate older adults to improve their lives through behavior change strategies (small steps) for both health and financial management.
- **Outcomes and Impacts:**
 - a. Agent training: Thirty-four county faculty were trained on how to implement the Small Steps to Health and Wealth™ for Older Adults curriculum and intended to use the materials in their county.
 - b. The curriculum is also available for Extension educators nationally on the Small Steps to Health and Wealth™ website <http://njaes.rutgers.edu/sshw/internal/>

- c. 2014-2015, 106 participants completed the program in Duval County. The majority reported a knowledge gain and 90% plan to make a positive change to their health and/or finances using information received from the program.

3f. Five Wishes

- **My Role:** I collaborated with VITAS Hospice to provide free *Five Wishes* documents to Extension. I obtained and distributed the documents to county faculty for distribution in their respective county.
- **Target Audience:** Adult Floridians
- **Outputs:** The *Five Wishes* document meets the legal requirements for a healthcare advance directive in 42 states including Florida.
- **Outcomes and Impacts:** Since 2012, 2,859 *Five Wishes* documents were distributed throughout Florida.

3g. Senior Financial Safety

- **My Role:** In 2011, I received a waiver from the Institute for Financial Literacy for the cost (\$1,194) of 120 workbooks for the Senior Financial Safety program.
- **Target Audience:** County Extension Faculty, Older Floridians, and Caregivers of Older Adults
- **Outputs:** Workbooks and multi-media instructional presentations are included in the curriculum. The program includes materials for creating and using money management tools, identify theft and other common fraud schemes, understanding ongoing financial planning needs, understanding Medicare and insurance products, and identifying and accessing resources. Additionally, the program materials include a chapter focused specifically for those providing care to seniors, including those who caring for both parents and children.
- **Outcomes and Impacts:** Agent training: Twenty-one county faculty (7 online and 14 in-person) were trained on how to implement the Senior Financial Safety curriculum and intended to use it in their county. Workbooks (120) were distributed for county use.

Other Extension Activities

1. 2017 – Present. Educated Florida foster and adoptive families on income taxes including the adoption tax credit and claiming a foster child as a dependent. This resulted in an estimated amount totaling over \$70,000 in tax savings to Florida families.
2. 2017 – Present. Educated Florida adoptive families on the Florida state employee adoption program benefit. This resulted in \$50,000 in benefits to Florida families.
